## SCOTT FINICAL COMMANDER, POLICE RESERVE

**C**ommander Scott Finical joined the Phoenix Police Department Reserve Bureau in 1984. Previously, he served as a Reserve Police Officer with the Tucson Police Department for four years.

After joining the Phoenix Police Department, he initially worked for 13 years as a patrol officer in the Maryvale and Squaw Peak Precincts. Subsequently, he attended detective school and became detective certified. He was then assigned to the Violent Crimes Bureau/Night Detective Unit, where he investigated homicides, suicides, suspicious

deaths and other major felony crimes. While assigned to the Violent Crimes Bureau, he was promoted to Sergeant and then Lieutenant. In 2003, he was promoted to Commander and he now oversees the operation of the Reserve Bureau.

For his career, Scott Finical is a director and shareholder (partner) with the Law Firm of Fennemore

Craig, where he maintains a general civil litigation practice. He has practiced with Fennemore Craig since 1983, immediately after graduating from the University of Arizona College of Law. His practice emphasis includes the defense of medical negligence cases, representing hospitals and physicians. His practice also includes the defense of catastrophic personal injury cases,

workers' compensation, and occupational health and safety law. He is admitted to practice law in both Arizona and California, and the federal courts, including the United States Supreme Court.
